Attachment 2

Eligibility Criteria

The following criteria are the minimum requirements for the scholarship. Applicants should check any additional requirements set by each Korean university.

- Applicants for scholarships for Master's degree programs must possess a **Bachelor's** degree, and applicants for scholarships for Doctoral studies programs must possess a Master's degree.
- All applicants must hold citizenship of IBRD and IDA recipient countries of WB¹. Applicants' parents (or legal guardians) must hold citizenship from another country other than ROK.
- Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of the entire curriculum from the previous degree program² must meet one of the conditions as follows: (i) score percentile should be 80% or above on a 100-point scale or be ranked in the top 20% of one's class, (ii) CGPA must be equal to or above 2.64/4.0, 2.80/4.3, 2.91/4.5, or 3.23/5.0.
- All applicants must be in good health, both mentally and physically, to study in ROK for the full duration of the program.
- Applicants must be under 40 years of age (born after September 1, 1985). Academic professors³ under 45 years of age are eligible to apply. No age limitations with Global Network Program⁴ applicants.

Required Documents

All documents must be submitted in English or Korean

- Documents written in English or Korean must be **apostilled or consular confirmed**.
- Documents written in other languages:
 - 1) must be submitted together with a certified translation in English or Korean,
 - 2) must be apostilled or consular confirmed (either original document or certified translation)

Applicants submit one set of apostilled/consular confirmed documents directly to the University they're applying to.

FAQs: Application Procedure

- **Can the applicant apply to multiple universities?**
 - Applicants can only apply to one university and one department. If an applicant is found to have applied to more than two universities, their scholarship will be cancelled.
- **When is the deadline for the application?**
 - Each University has a different application period. Please check the website of each university.
- **May the applicant submit their application to WB?**
 - No. Applicants must submit their application documents directly to the **university** they are applying. Submission to WB or KMOE/NIIED will not be accepted. Any documents mistakenly sent to WB/KMOE/NIIED will be excluded from the screening and will not be returned.

FAQs: Application Procedure

- **I'm expected to graduate from my current degree program in May of 2026. Am I eligible to apply for this program?**
 - Yes. Applicants who are expected to graduate by July 31st, 2026 can also apply for the program with a certificate of expected graduation. Such applicants must submit their official graduation certificate (or diploma) and final academic transcript to GKS Center, NIIED by July 31st, 2026. Failure to do so will result in the cancellation of your acceptance.
- **I have a master's degree. Can I apply for a master's degree program in a different major? Which degree certificate should I submit?**
 - You can apply for a master's program while holding another master's degree. If you are applying to a master's degree program, you should submit a degree certificate and academic transcript of your bachelor's degree. In this case, your CGPA of your bachelor's degree should meet the grade requirement in the application guidelines. Providing your master's degree certificate and academic transcript is optional.

FAQs: Application Procedure

- **I am applying for a doctoral degree program. Should I also submit a CGPA of my bachelor's degree?**
 - Applicants for a doctoral degree program should put a CGPA of their previous degree (master's degree) on the application form. Doctoral degree program applicants should submit the graduation certificate and official academic transcript of both bachelor's and master's degree. The CGPA required in the application is of the master's degree.
- **When it comes to faculty members, is this opportunity open only to those who are currently employed?**
 - Yes, students and graduates under the age of 40 are eligible to apply for the WB-ROK Scholarship. However, former faculty members are not eligible to apply.

FAQs: Language course

- **Is it mandatory for all GKS scholars to pass at least Level 3 in TOPIK after one year of Korean Language Program?**
 - Yes. Every GKS scholar (except scholars in Global Network program) must achieve at least Level 3 on TOPIK (Test of Proficiency in Korean) within a yearlong Korean language program to proceed to his or her degree program.
 - In addition, certain university or department requires students to submit a valid TOPIK certificate of level 4 or higher. Scholars who applied to such department may not enter their degree program if they fail to achieve the required TOPIK certificate during a yearlong Korean language program.

FAQs: Language course

- **The degree program I applied to is taught in English only. May I be exempt from the Korean Language Program?**
 - No. A yearlong Korean language program is an important part of the GKS program. (exception: Global Network Program)
 - However, if you have already attained advanced level (Level 5 or 6) on TOPIK when applying for the program, you must submit your valid TOPIK certificate to be exempt from Korean language program. You will directly start your degree program from September 2026.
 - If you attain TOPIK level 5 or 6 during the first 6 months of Korean language program, you will be exempt from the remaining 6-month language program, and you must start your degree program in the following semester (March, 2026).
 - Current academic professors who are apply for an exemption from Korean language training in a 100% English-taught program will be exempted from the Korean Language program.

FAQs: Required document


- **Whom should the applicant get a recommendation letter from?**
 - WB-ROK Scholarship applicant should get a recommendation letter from the Project manager of the WB Partner University.
- **For the legalization on “Required certificates”, can I choose between apostille or consular confirmation?**
 - Countries that have joined the Apostille Convention, can only issue an apostille. For the rest of the countries, you should obtain consular confirmation from the Korean embassy/consulate in your country.
 - If your country does not belong to the Apostille Convention or if the document cannot be apostilled, please obtain a consular confirmation from the Korean embassy/consulate.

FAQs: Others

- **May I change my final university choice during my Korean language program or during a degree program?**
 - No. Changing the university or transferring to another university is NOT PERMITTED.

WB-RoK GKS - International Organization Track

- 1. How do I know I am eligible to apply?**
 - You must be from World Bank-affiliated universities in Africa who meet the academic and admission requirements of a Korean university.
- 2. Must I be personally funded by a World Bank project?**
 - No; eligibility is based on your university's affiliation with a World Bank-supported project, not individual funding.
- 3. How do I know if my university is eligible?**
 - Your university should be able to confirm its affiliation with a World Bank-supported higher education or skills project.
- 4. Can my country be eligible even if the University is not?**
 - No; eligibility is institutional, not country-based, and depends on World Bank project affiliation.
- 5. How do I know which Korean universities participate?**
 - Applicants must identify programmes at Korean universities that accept GKS students. Information on the universities can also be found on the GKS scholarship call page.
- 6. Where do I find eligible programmes?**
 - On the Study in Korea GKS pages listing universities and programmes accepting international organization track applicants.
 - Once you find the university, then select the program that you desire
- 7. Who makes the final selection decision?**
 - Final selection is made by the Korean universities and the Government of the Republic of Korea.
- 8. Are there any priority academic fields?**
 - Fields aligned with development priorities, including engineering, health sciences, Data Science, technology, and applied research.
- 9. What documents are required?**
 - GKS Scholarship Application Forms, Academic transcripts, certificates, referees, and a **World Bank affiliation letter, and so on. Detailed document requirements are specified on the call page.**

Applicants are responsible for checking any additional documents required by the universities they select.

10. How are applications submitted?

- Applications are submitted directly to the university to which you are applying. It may be possible to submit at a RoK embassy in your home country, but you would need to confirm directly with the embassy if applying via the International Organization track]

11. Are there any current or former students, we applicants may contact for academic guidance?

- Yes, there are, **but** the admissions or graduate offices of the Korean universities offering the programmes provide more information.
- We have a chance to meet them during the information session [soon]

12. What is the most common reason applications fail?

- Weak academic alignment (official World Bank affiliation letter), late preparation and submission.
